ROLEX IN THE WORLD OF watch collecting, is more than just a name. It is the most powerful and well-known name in the history of watchmaking. We too have not been able to escape its magic.

And so it was quite natural when, without agenda, a conversation started about a thematic auction honoring this great brand and its countless achievements.

For once, we felt it was important to not only celebrate a specific model, but to narrate the brand's history and numerous landmark models. A shortlist was developed, where the goal was to list the manufacture's milestones and key developments. We realized that this was close to "Mission Impossible". We narrowed down the list and shared our idea with John Goldberger along with the entire international watch department at Phillips.

Obviously, this list could not be definitive for various reasons. On one hand, we concluded that if one were to ask ten Rolex scholars to create a shortlist, the ten lists would have substantial overlaps. On the other, there was no guarantee that we could find all the desired models for auction – especially examples that would meet our tight parameters in terms of originality and condition.

As a matter of fact, regretfully, we could not possibly find every 'Must Have' on our original list. The first generation Milgauss, reference 6541/6543, is one of them, to cite a specific example.

The team of specialists vetted each watch before it was examined and approved by John Goldberger. Undoubtedly, he is one of the world's leading scholars in the field of vintage collectable wristwatches. His eyes are likely the sharpest and the best trained in the field, thanks to nearly 40 years of experience. John Goldberger is not only a grande seigneur in our community, but also someone who is incredibly generous, in particular with his time, with sharing knowledge. We are consequently

incredibly grateful to John, for having made the time to embark on this journey with us, knowing how full of appointments his calendar is. For our part, it has been an higly rewarding experience to share, side-by-side with John, the making of this auction. We are in awe of his scholarship, experience, and passion.

If today you are holding this catalogue in your hands, it is thanks to Pucci Papaleo, Fabio Santinelli and the team of professionals of Pucci Papaleo Editions. 

I am of course especially grateful for the enthusiasm and trust given to us by international Rolex collectors and owners, who have kindly offered to consign their timepieces with us.





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

ROLEX EXPLORER

EXPLORATION IS, BASICALLY, A state of mind and soul. Tenacity, courage and passion for discovery are necessary to go above and beyond, to go where nobody has ever dared to venture 'before': standing atop the world's highest peaks, reaching the polar regions of the world, going as far down into the bowels of the earth, or standing right on the edge of a volcano.

It is indeed in this pioneering spirit that the Oyster Perpetual Explorer was created. On the 29th of May 1953, Sir Edmund Hillary and Sherpa Tenzing Norgay, successfully reached the summit of Mount Everest. The members of the British expedition, led by Colonel Sir John Hunt, were equipped with Rolex Oyster Perpetual watches. The Oyster Perpetual Explorer model was launched to celebrate this epic event.

Needless to say that it has embodied the spirit of adventure thus achieving iconic status ever since. It is no coincidence that still today Rolex continues to prove its watches under real-life conditions so as to improve the accuracy, the resistance and the reliability, subjecting the watches to extremes and constantly pushing the boundaries of technology.

Although Rolex first experimented with '3-6-9' dials in 1953, it was not until the arrival of reference 6350 that the manufacture officially used this dial configuration in their line of production.

The key objective in creating the Explorer was dial legibility. Radium was thus applied to the dial, with the iconic '3-6-9' numerals clearly recognizable even from far away. Unlike reference 6150, which bore 'Precision', reference 6350 was marked 'Officially Certified Chronometer', confirming the movement had been subject to stricter timing tests.

Following Sir Edmund Hillary and Tenzing Norgay's conquering of Mount Everest on 29 May 1953, the Explorer immediately rose to popularity. Rolex was one of the sponsors of the expedition, and supplied Oyster watches to the duo. While Rolex already registered the 'Explorer' patent on January 26, 1953, the name was officially adopted after Hillary and Norgay reached the peak of Everest.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

The example presented in these pages, fitted with an attractive black honeycomb dial with radium '3-6-9' Arabic numerals, is really quite stunning. It is the most delightful aspect of this watch.

The 'Swiss' dial is correct, and all the luminous material is original to the watch. The 'Explorer' dial also features a gilt chapter ring, which we see on early tool watches. The numerals have aged to a warm orange tone, and the gilt lettering and chapter ring is incredibly vibrant.

The case has been preserved in excellent condition, with full proportions, sharp finishes to the top of the lugs and crisp edges. The watch still retains its original Brevet crown.

Rolex launched the Explorer II in 1971, which provided a fresh update to the existing 'Explorer' line. Designed as a versatile aide for intrepid explorers, the bright orange luminous 24-hour triangle tipped hand glowed under any light condition.

Due to a limited market for such specialized timepieces, very few examples were sold. Reference 1655 is thus particularly rare, especially when compared to other Rolex sports watches. Interestingly, reference 1655 is also known as the 'Steve McQueen'. While there is no concrete evidence confirming the actor ever wore this watch, legend becomes fact, and the wristwatch is now playfully named after the icon.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

I am most pleased by the splendid condition of this watch. Featuring crisp bevels, milled finish to the lugs and sharp bezel, the watch is also complete with all its original accessories.

The present watch is fitted with a Mk 4 dial, which is correct for the serial range. The dial features a 'T Swiss <25 T' designation underneath 6 o'clock, instead of 'T Swiss T', which was printed on earlier generations. The numerals have furthermore aged with warm orange patina, which match the hands and seconds lollipop. The Rolex coronet is also longer, and the base of the coronet is slightly rounder in shape. The watch features a correct later-generation seconds hand with luminous lollipop.





ROLEX MILGAUSS

N 1956, AS IF THERE WAS intentionally the desire to restate the professional identity of its watches, or at least a good part of them, Rolex launched the Milgauss, the world's first watch specifically created for use in environments with high exposure to electromagnetic fields, such as power stations or research labs. It is surely no coincidence that CERN scientists (European Organization for Nuclear Research), the world's most respected international laboratory of nuclear physics – famous for hosting the largest and most powerful particle accelerator ever known to exist – were the first to test this watch 'in the field'.

The Milgauss was equipped with a protective internal shield made in soft iron that Rolex itself described as a sort of 'cage'. This equipment protected the timepiece against magnetic fields of up to 1.000 oersted (the unit that measures the magnetic field strength), whereas ordinary watches already started to show the first malfunctioning signs at even lower levels. Hence the name of the watch, 'mille' being French for thousand and 'gauss' the unit of a magnetic field, which corresponds to the oersted unit.

Rolex released the following models: the references 6541, 6543 and 1019, which was different from its predecessor. This model was available with either silver or black dial, and was produced until the late '80s. The restricted production of Milgauss watches is one of the reasons why it soon became highly sought-after amongst vintage horology collectors.

Reference 1019 was introduced to the market as the successor of reference 6541 and 6543. While the new Milgauss retained its Faraday Cage in order to protect the movement from outside energy, the model also featured a fresh and modern update to its appearance.

At the time of production, the reference was not particularly successful and production numbers were low. Indeed, the present watch was sitting in the retailer's stock for over ten years before it was sold. The model is highly sought after today due to its rarity. Reference 1019 was available with a silver or matte black dial, and ceased production around 1990.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

The present watch is a very exceptional and complete example of the reference 1019. It is amongst the most impressive examples with a black dial to appear on the market so far.

It is accompanied with its original punched guarantee displaying country code for Switzerland (014) and stamped for the Swiss retailer Brunati.

The pristine condition of this wristwatch can be described as astounding. The case is original without doubt, with sharp factory finishes to the top of the lugs, crisp bevels and original bracelet. Even the original Rolex factory sticker to the case back has been retained in crisp condition. Barely worn and virtually untouched, this watch model enables us to admire how a reference 1019 left the factory in the 1979.

ROLEX DIVERS' WATCHES

NYONE WHO HAS had the chance to explore the wonderful underwater world will never forget the thrilling experience. The reliable timepiece represents an essential accessory and thus must be waterproof to ensure a perfect functioning, despite the high pressures of the ocean's depths. These are the words of a Rolex advertisement campaign from 1957, which perfectly envisioned the architectural reason and the philosophical functionality of one of its most famed models: the Submariner. For over half a century this model represented the ultimate watch tool, the faithful companion of entire generations of scuba divers, a timepiece constantly imitated, and worn with the same passion both by gentlemen and ladies.

The forefather of this horological dynasty was the Turn-O-Graph, introduced to the market in that same year with the reference 6202 and manufactured in approximately a thousand pieces.


Rolex never ceased its developing process, marked by key reference such as the Sea-Dweller models. A story that still today is being narrated by the endless number of divers' watches adorning the wrists all over the world.

First released in 1953, the Turn-O-Graph was designed as the precursor to the 'tool watch', such as the Submariner. At the time, the model was truly different from anything that was offered on the market.

The newly introduced rotating bezel, calibrated to 60 minutes, allowed for accurate timekeeping. While reference 6202 was not the first Rolex wristwatch to carry a rotating bezel (the honor goes to the elusive Zerograph), it was the very first serially produced reference to feature one. The rotating bezel itself is a very important advancement as it inspired successors such as the Thunderbird and GMT-Master.

Turn-O-Graphs were released with different dial configurations, such as the gilt lacquer or honeycomb variant. Initially, the GMT-Master and Submariner overshadowed the Turn-O-Graph. Due to the model's unpopularity, the 6202 reference ceased production early and limited examples were manufactured. Consequently, examples such as the present watch are incredibly rare today.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

One of my favorite aspects of this watch is the attractive black lacquer dial, which is still very glossy in its finish. The gilt graphics are incredibly clear, and the numerals have aged with orange patina, which match the original gilt hands and lollipop seconds hand. The bezel insert is original and has a lot of character. As with Turn-O-Graphs of the period, the luminous index at 6 o'clock is brighter than the other radium numerals. Rolex most likely designed this to enhance readability. The bracelet is furthermore from the period, stamped for the second quarter of 1956.



Reference 6536 is amongst the rarest and earliest of all Submariners. Produced for one year only in 1955, it most notably features no crown guards, a 'small crown', rotating bezel and gilt black lacquer 'Swiss' dial.

This watch is a double reference 6536/6538, which is clearly a transitional example, as the case back displays the number 6536, along with 6538 crossed out by Rolex.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

This watch displays all the original characteristics of a reference 6536/6538. The dial is, of course, the most splendid aspect of the watch. Still retaining its black lacquer finish with grainy patina, the radium plots have aged with warm orange patina, which match the gilt hands and seconds lollipop wonderfully. The 'Swiss' dial furthermore features a gilt chapter ring, which is correct for the reference. The radium index at 6 o'clock is brighter in tone, which is also correct.

While these attributes are very rare, one more detail propels this watch to the next level: the red depth rating. Only the very earliest examples carried a red depth rating above 6 o'clock as Rolex tested some watches during the period with a red '100/330' designation. Approximately 10 examples with these particular characteristics have appeared on the market today.

The watch features a really crisp case, which still displays bevels and boasts a robust 37.5 mm. case diameter. The bezel insert is correct, and the bracelet is original, stamped for the third quarter of 1954.



First released in 1955, reference 6538 is one of the most desirable Submariner models today, due to its versatility, rarity and good looks. In production for four years only, reference 6538 is instantly recognizable, and characterized by its black lacquer 'Swiss' dial, lack of crown guards and 8 millimeter Brevet 'big' crown. Some examples, such like the present watch, were chronometer certified, and thus displayed 'Officially Certified Chronometer' on the dial, in addition to the depth rating. These 'four liner' dials are especially rare and sought after today.

Reference 6538 is immortalized on film, having accompanied Sean Connery's James Bond on multiple secret missions. Bond's gadget is disguised as a 'Big Crown' Submariner, which is equipped with different spying abilities. Reference 6538 is today known as the 'James Bond Submariner' in the collecting community.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

This 'Big Crown' with ROW movement is among the very last produced. The watch sports an original black lacquer 'Swiss' dial that has turned subtly 'tropical' with age, displaying a chocolate brown color. The graphics are vibrant and the gilt and silver combination is a nice touch. The intact luminous round plots exhibit an orange patina. The luminous index at 6 o'clock is slightly brighter than the rest, which is correct.

The case has been preserved wonderfully and retains its beveled edges. Tool watches were initially considered 'everyday' items, rather than 'precious' watches. In fact, it was common for their owners to wear and polish them frequently. To find one in such original condition is delightful.



The Military Submariner, or Milsub, is imbued with history. Made upon special request for the British Ministry of Defense, Milsubs were worn during combat and on special missions. Research suggests that approximately 1500 units were delivered, from 1971 to 1979 and less than a few hundred survive today in original condition. The present example, a double reference 5513/5517, displays reference 5513 between the lugs, and 5517 engraved under the lug.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

All Milsubs display special characteristics requested by the British government. While the Milsub's subtleties are aesthetically pleasing to collectors today, these nuances were designed for specific military purposes. All dials displayed a military designated 'T' within a circle, which was the international symbol for Tritium. Most examples were also fitted with sword hands. Another feature was the 60-minute revolving bezel insert, instead of the typical 15-minute calibrated bezel. The government also requested a hack feature, non-reflective case and fixed bar lugs.

Finally, all watches displayed military engravings on the case back. 'W-10' watches were recorded by Rolex as being delivered to the Central Ordanance depot in Donnington, England for onward delivery to the Army Air Corp. The inside case back on this watch is repeated with the serial number, which is correct for a special order watch.

The characteristics above are all displayed on the present watch, which is very impressive. Reference 5513/5517's particular components were never available for civilians, nor were they ever mass-produced. The existence of this watch is thus incredibly rare today.

Launched around 1967, reference 1680 was the first Submariner model to be fitted with a date function. The model was most typically cased in stainless steel. Early examples displayed a 'meters first' depth rating, with the 'Submariner' script printed in red, hence the name 'Red Submariner.'

Yet, an even more unusual Submariner is one cased in vellow gold. Reference 1680 was the first Submariner model to be cased in the precious metal, which provided a fresh, glamorous and luxurious update to the watch most traditionally associated with stainless steel.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

This watch is a very cool variant of the yellow gold Submariner, as the dial has 'turned' from a blue color, like the bezel, to a wonderful hazy purple color. While one would expect a black colored dial to have a 'tropical' effect, it is very surprising when a blue dial also ages over time.

The 'tropical' effect can only be achieved when the dial interacts with the sun, causing the pigment to react and 'turn'. The center of the dial is a lighter purple tone, emanating and growing darker towards the edges, giving the watch a dégradé finish.

The case is furthermore preserved in excellent condition with sharp finishes to the top of the lugs, bevels, and crisp hallmarks to the back of the lugs. The watch is also fitted with the popular 'nipple' dial, with tritium raised markers, which have aged with ivory patina and match the hands. The plexi crystal is furthermore original.






Watches fitted with custom Middle East dials were often presented as gifts to ambassadors, dignitaries, or staff, as a token of gratitude or respect. It was an honor to be presented a Rolex watch with the state symbol. In fact, many of these watches are cherished by their original owners, and passed down from one generation to the next. As a result, Rolex watches with custom dials hardly appear on the market.

The present watch features a 'Khanjar' dial, displaying the 'Khanjar' symbol, part of the national emblem of Oman. Watches fitted with 'Khanjar' dials were made on special request from His Majesty Qaboos bin Said Al Said, the Sultan of Oman, and presented as gifts to his closest dignitaries and servants.

Research suggests that His Majesty Al Said commissioned Rolex to create special Sea-Dwellers in the 1970s. These were presented to members of Britain's elite Special Forces branch, the SAS, as a token of gratitude for defeating the Dhofar Rebellion. The Sea-Dwellers were either fitted with a gold Khanjar, a red Qaboos signature, or a red Khanjar, such as the present watch. Rolex scholars hypothesize that around 80 to 90 Sea-Dwellers with red Omani text were manufactured.



Most importantly, the watches were ordered through Asprey, and it is imperative that these watches bear the retailer's logo engraved in the case back.

We are so honored to present such a rare, historical and interesting watch that is fresh to the auction market.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

The present watch with 3.56 million serial, correct in so many ways, is complete with its original guarantee and original box with 'Khanjar' logo.

It is among the first batch of 'Khanjar' Sea-Dwellers to be released. The dial is preserved in astounding condition, the red emblem exhibiting bright red tones and emblazoned above 6 o'clock.

I am particularly fond of the luminous, which displays beautiful deep warm patina, matching the numerals, hands and seconds lollipop perfectly.

The case retains sharp edges and displays crisp bevels. The Asprey logo on the case back is clear, legible and very important to the watch's legitimacy. Furthermore, the inside case back is repeated with the serial number, confirming it was manufactured upon special order. Accompanying the watch is a Rolex letter stating it was supplied to Asprey in the early 1970s.

ROLEX GMT-MASTER

Boeing 747 and landing at the airport of New Delhi. The three hundred sixty-two passengers have disembarked, and you are relaxing. You are wondering how your family is doing in New York. You look at your watch and it's a Rolex GMT-Master, indicating the local time. The rotating external ring will display a second time zone, New York. Obviously, this exclusive feature has many uses, professional and not. However, it is actually not the only reason why Pan Am chose the GMT-Master as the official chronometer. The main reason is that the GMT-Master is a Rolex Oyster.

This was the story advertised by a Rolex campaign of the '70s, and no other words would have explained better the essence of this iconic model.

All began when civil air transportation took its first steps with the Boeing 707, the first successful jet plane to fly international routes. The first airline company to purchase this jet was the Pan American Airways, reducing the transoceanic travel time from 13 to only 7 hours. Narrowing down the time zone gap in such a brief time increased the 'jet lag' disorder and therefore the American airline company was primarily concerned about the physical – but even more – mental resistance of its pilots, realizing that providing a 'home' reference time along with the destination time would have helped.


The name GMT-Master, was a tribute to Greenwich Mean Time, the international civil time standard. What followed afterwards was only the evolution of a gifted idea that – as often happens with the Geneva watch manufacturer – has transformed a tool watch into the beloved icon model cherished by millions of collectors and enthusiasts.



Reference 1675 was introduced in 1960 as the successor of the reference 6542. Early examples, such as the present watch, featured pointed crown guards. The steel insert did not carry radium, which by then was considered a health hazard.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

Rolex produced a limited number of dials in 1962 and 1963 featuring both an 'underline' and 'double Swiss' signature, which we see on this watch. Scholars hypothesize that this designates a transitional period where Rolex used tritium instead of radium. This watch's 1 million serial number supports this theory, as does the inside case back, stamped for the third quarter of 1963.

Since 'double Swiss underline' watches were produced for such a short time, examples like this are very rare. The numerals on this wristwatch have 'turned' a rather beautiful light yellow color, which consistently match the hands. The lacquer dial is intact, and all the gilt lettering has been preserved in excellent condition. Furthermore, the timepiece pictured here is fitted with a small tipped luminous hand and 'Cornino' pointed crown guards, which is correct for early examples.

The red sector of the bezel has faded to an orange tone, while the blue sector displays a sky blue color. The present watch is a truly fantastic example, complemented by the addition of its bracelet, box and hang tag.



First released in in 1954, the GMT-Master reference 6542 was designed for pilots to use in their line of work. With the rise of international travel in the 1940s and 1950s, Rolex initially created the model for Pan Am airlines to track dual time zones. This ingenious design featured an immediately recognizable bakelite bezel with the twenty-four hour radium numerals painted on the underside, made to glow in any weather condition. Bakelite was Rolex's material of choice, due to its low reflectivity and high readability. The additional luminous 24 hour tipped hand allowed the viewer to immediately track a second time zone.

Given that the GMT-Master was created for specific, work-related purposes, most examples were cased in stainless steel. These watches were worn in the most practical sense and made to withstand the elements. Yet, Rolex also manufactured a very limited number of watches cased in yellow gold, and fitted with a brown bakelite bezel. Due to the immense fragility of these watches, it is incredibly rare to find examples fitted with their original bakelite insert. The fact is even more pertinent as most of the bakelite bezels were recalled by Rolex due to their radium content. The original GMT-Master eventually ceased production in 1959.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION


The watch illustrated in these pages, among the last batch of reference 6542s to be released, is presented in excellent and astounding condition. The bakelite bezel is intact, with hardly any blemishes and the radium is without losses. The brown lacquer dial displays rich tones, and the case is incredibly crisp, with a sharp milled finish to the top of the lugs and a sharp hallmark to the back of the lug.

The GMT-Master is most famously, and typically, cased in stainless steel. While reference 6542 and 1675 were sometimes cased in precious metals, these were infrequent occurrences. Indeed, it was not until the arrival of reference 16758 in 1979, that the GMT-Master was set with rubies, diamonds and sapphires, thus inspiring its nickname, 'SARU'.

Heavy, robust and lavishly set with either a diamond-sapphire, or diamond-sapphire-ruby bezel, reference 116748 reinterprets the original SARU, providing a dressy alternative to the classic stainless steel GMT-Master II. It is important to note that very few examples of reference 116748 were fitted with the diamond-sapphire bezel. According to our research, less than six examples have surfaced on the market so far.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

This GMT-Master II is fitted with baguette sapphires and diamonds to the bezel. Offered in pristine condition, with guarantee, sales tag, fitted presentation box and outer packaging, this watch is as good as it gets in terms of modern GMT models.

Rolex is particularly skilled at selecting, and setting the very best stones. This is particularly apparent as the sapphires are very well matched and display a wonderful sky blue hue.

The present wristwatch is from the first generation of the diamond-set GMT-Master II as the lugs are not embellished with diamonds, which is the more sought-after variant, and much rarer to find on the market than the version enriched with full diamond-set lugs.





ROLEX OYSTER

NE OF THE absolute pillars of modern watchmaking history is based on the Oyster production, the forefather of a watch family we commonly define today as 'sport-elegant models'.

All started from a brilliant yet simple idea to create a water resistant case back by means of a secure screw down system: the Oyster. It immediately turned out to be Rolex's winning card.


Originally, the idea was to produce a timepiece primarily designated to be a sports watch. However, the creative flair and the visual insight in constantly restyling new shapes and designs based on one single concept marked the very beginning of the great history of the Geneva-based watch house. The Oyster watch collection rolled out a variety of case models: the carré cambré, the rounded, the equidistant or elongated octagonal, and the tonneau version, which more than any other had a powerful impact, so as to become the Rolex par excellence. Mechanically speaking, the early hand winding movements were soon replaced with the automatic ones, which assured a better functionality as well as a higher practical use.

The developing process started in 1931 with the first Oyster Perpetual that has since proved to be the most appreciated by watch lovers, given the fact that throughout all these years the many generations recognised it as one of their favourites despite the frivolous styles imposed by fashion.

Cased in an array of metals and fitted with a variety of dials, 'bubble back' watches were in production for over 22 years, from the early Thirties to the mid Fifties. For many years, the 'bubble back' wristwatch was Rolex's best selling model.

At the time of production, the 'bubble back' was officially named the 'Oyster Perpetual'. The nickname 'bubble back' derived from the convex shape of the case back used to house the new automatic winding system, which replaced the mechanical mechanism.

Reference 3372 was first introduced to the market in 1940. At the time of production, the model's appearance was very unusual. The watch featured a 'machine' bezel, showcasing a threaded design that is still very appealing and eye catching today.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

This 'bubble back' is wonderful. Given the popularity of the watch during its day, many surviving watches have been altered at some point, which makes original examples very rare.


This watch is fitted with a completely original two-tone dial with Arabic 9-12-3 luminous numerals, and still retains original luminous to the hands. The case is particularly stunning, with crisp numbers behind the case back that would have disappeared with even the slightest of polishing. The lugs and case are full in their proportions. The bezel furthermore features deep threading, which is a defining characteristic of reference 3372. The Oyster crown is furthermore original to the watch, adding another element of delight.

Rolex released its very first DateJust, reference 4467, in 1945 to celebrate the firm's 40th anniversary. Fitted with a date wheel at 3 o'clock, the watch featured an Oyster case, 'Bubble Back' movement and 'coin edge' bezel. At the time of production, the DateJust was the world's first automatic chronometer wristwatch to display the date on the dial. The now-iconic Jubilee bracelet was specially designed for the model.

Typically cased in yellow, pink, or white gold, the model has featured a diverse range of designs over the years, such as the 'bark' finished motif, or the 'Florentine' and 'Morellis' pattern. Reference 1601 is characterized by its fluted bezel, which shimmers softly by catching the light in different angles. This effect that only be achieved by using precious metals.

Manufactured around 1963, the present watch displays two impressive features, distinguishing it from its peers. Retaining a glossy finish, the sensational black lacquer dial features gilt graphics, giving it a vintage appearance. Spade numerals and sword hands finish off the look. These attributes are commonly associated with older DateJusts, making the present watch very unusual. This dial is among the very last batch of gilt 'Swiss' dials, before Rolex altered the luminous material to tritium.

The original 'Tile-Link' bracelet, carrying a French import mark, is also another beautiful feature. Stamped for the first quarter of 1962, it is extremely thick and fluid, attesting to Rolex's superior craftsmanship. Most intriguing are the matching French hallmarks to the case back, which are still very strong and deep despite the watch being over 50 years of age.

First launched in 1954, the 'Tru-Beat' model was originally marketed to doctors and medical professionals as an aide to calculate pulse rates. The 'Tru-Beat' has a dead-seconds complication, meaning the second hand ticks, thus dividing each minute into segments. The 'Tru-Beat' mechanism was truly different than anything offered on the market.

Many watchmakers did not have the ability to repair such movements, and switched out the mechanism in favor of typical automatic movements, hence the rarity of a correct example today. Another element of delight is the watch's provenance, having been sold at Antiquorum's historic The Mondani Collection of 309 Rolex Wristwatches auction.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION


This yellow gold watch, fitting a mesh bracelet, is possibly the finest and most complete 'Tru-Beat' I have ever seen. The silvered dial is lovely. The white gold markers reflect the yellow gold case, and are accompanied by original, perfectly round, luminous that has aged to a warm orange colour. Most striking is the 'cross' on the dial, usually reserved for examples cased in stainless steel. The case features a sharp milled finish to the top of the lugs and a crisp hallmark beneath. The accompanying bracelet, stamped for the first quarter of 1962, is beautifully crafted. Less than 10 examples cased in yellow gold are known to the market today.

Reference 6062 is one of two Rolex models to feature a triple calendar complication paired with a moon phase indication. While reference 6062 features a screw down Oyster case back, reference 8171 features a snap-on case back.

Launched at the Basel fair in 1950, reference 6062 was the first automatic wristwatch with date and moon phase housed in a waterproof case. Cased in stainless steel, yellow gold and pink gold, the model was fitted with a number of dial variants. The most exclusive and desirable version is, without a doubt, one fitted with eight faceted stars in lieu of hour numerals. Such is the desirability, and popularity of the watch, that collectors have dubbed it 'Stelline', meaning 'starlet' in Italian.

This example of a reference 6062 is furthermore completely fresh to the market, having surfaced to the public just recently. We are incredibly honored to present this watch. It is an opportunity to satiate even the most demanding of collectors and watch scholars.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

The present 'Stelline', preserved in incredible condition, is one if the most beautiful examples of the reference.

The dial condition can only be described as incredible – most examples are spotted throughout, due to aging and exposure to environmental elements. This dial is free of imperfections. The numerals on the outer track are inky blue, and the day and date apertures are sharp and angular, demonstrating the originality of the dial.



The outer track has furthermore aged slightly faster than the center, giving the dial a two-tone appearance. The luminous stars, the most important aspect of the dial, are untouched. Each luminous within is perfectly rounded, placed precisely within each star. The "Officially Certified Chronometer" designation within the moon phase subsidiary dial is a particularly nice touch.

The yellow gold case, preserved in excellent condition, displays a sharp hallmark to the bottom of the lug. There is light tamishing in the form of patina, which really gives this watch so much character and history, furthermore attesting to its untouched condition. The Super Oyster crown is original, as is the Jubilee bracelet, stamped for the third quarter of 1952.

The rotating bezel has always been a landmark feature in Rolex's production line, as a constant aid to divers, pilots and other technical-related professionals. While the Turn-O-Graph was the very first Rolex model to officially feature a rotating bezel, the reference ceased production after a few years due to its lack of popularity.

Rolex merged the 'Turn-O-Graph' with the 'DateJust' in 1954 with reference 6309. The model was advertised with images of the U.S. Air Force acrobatic flying team, or 'Group Number 3600 of Air Demonstration'. Reference 6309 and its successors adopted the namesake 'Thunderbird' after the flying team's emblem. The present watch, reference 1625, is a later reinterpretation of the original 'Thunderbird', featuring an updated case shape and movement caliber.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

The present watch, reference 1625, is most commonly cased in stainless steel or a steel and gold combination. The model was hardly cased in yellow gold only. Like the 'Turn-O-Graph', the 'Thunderbird' was not particularly commercially successful during its day, which makes the presence of this model very rare. This watch was sitting in the retailer's stock for eight years before its subsequent sale on 2 December 1986.


The present watch is complete with its original punched guarantee and fitted presentation box. It is also preserved in alluring condition, with sharp finishes and impeccable proportions to the case. I particularly like that the Jubilee bracelet is original to the watch, stamped 'A' for 1976.

The present watch is prominently illustrated in the 100 Superlative Rolex Watches App by John Goldberger.

It is widely acknowledged among Rolex scholars and collectors, that the Day-Date is the most varied, unusual and creative model the firm has ever produced. The Day-Date was Rolex's first model to display separate day and date apertures. Since the model's official launch in 1956, the Day-Date has seen a multitude of watch design variations.

Cased in yellow gold, pink gold, white gold or platinum, the Day-Date has been fitted with a plethora of dials, ranging from those set in delicate hard stone, to ones heavily embellished with diamonds. The firm has designed a series of special bracelets on top of the iconic President style, such as the 'tile-link', Milanese, 'Octopussy', brick-link textured bracelet and more.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

I am attracted by the clean, simple geometric lines of the Day-Date's which balance very well with its different eye catching variations. The present Day-Date, fitted with a turquoise colored 'Stella' dial and yellow gold mesh bracelet, really embodies the Rolex philosophy of merging aesthetics with practical function. Beyond telling the 'Day' and 'Date', this watch features a lacquer dial that is colorful and eye catching.


The original bracelet, designed with an unusual mesh pattern, is very thick and of stupendous quality, and stamped for the third quarter of 1971. This case is unpolished, full in proportions with sharp finishes throughout. It carries a deep hallmark to the back of the lug.

Throughout the 1970s and 1980s, Rolex channeled their resources in creating their very own in-house quartz movements, one of them being the caliber 5055. Also known as the OysterQuartz, this caliber functioned similarly and accurately as any automatic Day-Date movement, such as the caliber 1556. The OysterQuartz was a very important model for Rolex, as it demonstrated the firm's ability to create high- end quartz movements.

Rolex produced a variety of OysterQuartz watches, ranging from those fitted with wooden-made dials, to others further embellished with precious gemstones, or even a 'Pyramide' motif.

Rolex eventually ceased production of caliber 5055 around 2001. Yet, OysterQuartz wristwatches have only become more desirable, collectable and rare as a result. The Ref. 19019, was cased exclusively in white gold.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

The term 'unpolished' is often used lightly, to the point where some have banned its use. Yet, I cannot think of a better way to describe this watch. Cased in the rare white gold version, this OysterQuartz retains all original bevels and proportions. All crisp factory finishes remain to the top of the lugs, case back and bracelet. Behind the lugs display strong hallmarks, case numbers and reference number. The beautifully-preserved white lacquer 'Stella' dial is intact, exhibiting a glossy finish.

I can only imagine that this watch has been lovingly cherished in a safe, only to surface today for the pleasure of collectors and Rolex scholars.

Reference 1831 is the exclusive – and elusive – automatic platinum Day-Date that is fitted in an OysterQuartz case. In fact, the reference can be considered the most mystical among all Day-Dates ever produced.

According to our research, reference 1831 was manufactured in 1977, exclusively for the Shah of Iran. The watches were gifted to His Majesty's most distinguished dignitaries, and members of his close circle. Research suggests that the model was released in 8 examples only, with each watch cased exclusively in platinum.

The present watch is engraved No 001 to the case back, leading us to believe that it was the first within the batch to be released. Out of four known examples, two are fitted with Stella dials, and two are fitted with diamond-set numerals.

Another similar example, however fitted with a burgundy 'Stella' diamond-set dial and bezel was sold at Phillips' Glamorous Day-Date sale in 2015, achieving a staggering price of 305,000 CHF.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

This watch fulfills every description of a superlative Day-Date: majestic, exclusive and incredibly precious.

Reference 1831 is particularly unique as it merges the OysterQuartz case with the King Midas style bracelet. This unusual combination is really



extraordinary, and displays Rolex's strength in designing a spectrum of watches, from practical tool watches, all the way to luxurious masterpieces for royalty.

At first glance, this example is immediately distinguished by its sheer weight. The watch weighs an impressive 287 grams. The case is preserved in excellent condition. I particularly admire the sharp and deep hallmarks, as well as the reference and case numbers, which are clearly engraved beneath the lugs.

The dial, preserved in fantastic condition, is set with brilliant and baguette-cut diamonds to an attractive light blue dial. Most interestingly, the diamond hour markers are set in the middle of the minute track, which is slightly further outward in position compared to the regular Day-Date watches. The bezel is furthermore fitted with 50 round-cut diamonds.









ROLEX NON-OYSTER

F ARE BY NOW quite comfortable with identifying the Rolex production with the big and rightly famed Oyster family. We often fall into the psychological trap to consider the rest of the Rolex production as a sort of lesser sibling. Nothing could be further from the truth. Because reality is way more exciting.

The quality and the originality of the 'non-Oyster' is perfectly exemplified by the Prince, a watch but even more a movement, manufactured and patented in 1927. The baguette calibre is entirely in-house built, specifically designed to visually separate the hours and the minutes from the seconds, in order to perfectly grant an easy reading. This graphic configuration offered a excellent legibility, highly appreciated by professionals such as doctors—it is no coincidence that one of its many nicknames will be the 'doctor's watch'. With regard to traditional watchmaking, it is impossible not to forget some of the main modern milestones, such as the Moonphase Calendar reference 8171 from the '50s, cased either in gold or stainless steel and exhibiting the moonphase aperture indication.


However, whilst Rolex indeed became the reference point as for the water resistant watches, the chronograph production still remained linked to the snap down cases, such as the reference 4062.

Resuming our initial thoughts on the great variety of watch models, further importance must be given to the fact that throughout its long history Rolex has deposited more than 400 patents: the result of an authentically integrated and independent manufacturer, that designed and produced all the fundamental components of its watches.

Released to the market in 1928, the Rolex Prince was initially known as the 'doctor's' watch, due to its unbelievable accuracy. Rolex certainly capitalized on this concept, as seen from advertising in the period. Prince watches generally feature two different case styles: the sharp, angled and rectangular model, such as the present watch, is known as the 'Classic'. The other model, with flared sides and curved edges, is known as the 'Brancard'. A variety of metals were used to case Princes, ranging from yellow gold, to sterling silver and even platinum.

At the time of production, the Prince was truly different from anything else that was offered on the market. Its slim, discreet and elegant appearance represented the ultimate gentleman's wristwatch.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

This watch is, without a doubt, among the best preserved Princes to ever appear on the market. The dial is completely untouched, which is incredibly rare today, as many Prince dials have been 'retouched' at some point. It remains free of any obstructing blemishes and the graphics are very sharp and legible.

The 9k case, a rarity in its own right, is preserved in crisp condition. The Rolex coronet, case number and reference number is incredibly deep to the case back. The inside case back furthermore features 9 carat 'Double F' import hallmarks for Glasgow, and the import letter 'O' for 1937.


The chronometer movement is a very nice addition, and furthermore confirmed by the Rolex Technical Laboratories Certificate dated 4 March 1938. The watch furthermore retains its original fitted presentation box. These accessories, preserved in remarkably good condition, enable us to admire how a Rolex Prince would have left the factory 80 years ago.

Reference 4062 was produced from 1942 until approximately 1963. The model was cased in a variety of metals, ranging from yellow gold, pink gold, stainless steel, to stainless steel and gold combinations.

The reference sometimes features a ribbed band, giving the watch a very unusual appearance compared to its peers. Square pushers furthermore compliment the thin and elegant case.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

Produced during the middle of reference 4062's lifespan, this example is very rare due to a number of reasons. Most strikingly, the dial has been preserved in immaculate condition. One would expect a watch, fitted with a snap-on case back to be exposed to the elements, and thus tarnished and spotted heavily. However, this pink dial is crisp despite its age, and complete with raised graphics. The Telemetre and Tachometre scales are precisely painted and slightly faded, attesting to the dial's originality.

Secondly, the watch is among very few examples fitted with a ribbed 'canalé' finish to the band and the tear-drop lugs. Most examples have finishing to the band only, or feature completely smooth lugs and band.

Thirdly, the dial features the signature of Swiss retailer Varini Locamo at 12 o'clock. The signature adds another element of surprise, balancing with the 'Antimagnetique' designation beautifully.

Finally, the stainless steel and pink gold combination makes for an incredibly attractive wristwatch, which is furthermore enhanced by the original Rolex rice-grain bracelet.

Reference 8171 is lovingly dubbed 'Padellone', which translate to 'large frying pan' in Italian. Boasting a generous 38 mm case, it is slightly larger than its waterproof 'Oyster' sibling, reference 6062. It is interesting to note that both reference 8171 and 6062 were the only two 'complicated' models that Rolex ever produced, giving both references a mythical reputation and cult-like following.

Most interestingly, both models were produced for a very short period of time in the early 1950s. To acquire even one of these watches has become a dream for many collectors today.

Reference 8171 and 6062 were available in yellow gold, pink gold, and most exclusively, in stainless steel.

A similar example, cased in stainless steel, was sold at Phillips' The Geneva Watch Auction: TWO, lot 167, for an astounding 905,000 CHF.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

The present watch captivates and surprises in so many ways. The case is crisp, with sharp finishing to the bezel and the top of the lugs. The central band, too, retains immaculate satin-finishes. The same can be said for the case back, which displays a sharp coronet and crisp case numbers. The lines, curves, and finishes are all completely original.

As with all 'Padellone' watches, the beauty lies in the dial. Those in original condition, such as this one, are few and far between, appearing infrequently on the market. The sharp track, where the moon phase aperture meets the rim of the subsidiary dial, is incredibly precise and correct. The sharp dagger numerals complement the ivory dial, and draw

attention to the perfect blue outer date ring. One would expect to see significant spotting to the dial considering that this watch is not waterproof and over 60 years old. Yet, it remains clear of blemishes.

At the time of production, watches dressed in yellow gold or pink gold livery were considered the most valuable, with stainless steel examples often chosen for everyday wear. As such, one is more likely to find an untouched example in gold. To find such an immaculate and original example, cased in stainless steel, has been a real pleasure for me.

Rolex has long reserved its finest, and most outstanding work for its most exclusive clients. On top of the firm's landmark models, Rolex is gifted at conceiving the very best cloisonné enamel designs. Particularly during the 1940s and 1950s, Rolex commissioned the esteemed dial maker Stern Frères, to realize its vision.

Founded in 1868 by brothers Charles and Jean Stern, Stern Frères is best known for creating beautiful cloisonné enamel dials, ranging from characters of mythical lore, to maps of the continents and beyond.

To bring an enamel painting to life, the cloisons are painstakingly molded and hammered to the shape of the artisan's desire. This process is technically extremely difficult because gold wire requires a delicate and meticulous handling. The cloisons are subsequently filled with enamel paste and successively fired in a kiln.

Due to the immense difficulty and high cost in creating cloisonné enamel masterpieces, Rolex commissioned Stern Frères to create very few dials.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

This stunning cloisonné enamel dial features Neptune riding the sea, proudly grasping his trident and pulled by sea horses. Rendered in polychrome cloisonné enamel, the shimmering, yet translucent blues and greens of the water blend seamlessly together, contrasting against the vibrant deity. Each brushstroke is exceptionally captivating, and the yellow gold numerals draw attention to the masterpiece illustrated in these pages, urging the viewer to marvel at each detail.

The back of the dial is correctly stamped with Stem Frères numbers. The first three numbers, 103, denote Stem's client code for Rolex. The star represents Stem Frères, and the following numbers 758 represent




the order number, which is confirmed in the Stern archives as being commissioned for a 'Neptune' theme and created by famous enameller Mrs. Nelly Richard.

This watch is accompanied with a luxurious and very heavy bracelet, adding another element of delight.

The case back is further stamped, to the best of our knowledge, with Dublin import hallmarks for 1954.

Research suggests that no other square-shaped enamel dial depicting Neptune has ever graced the market, leading us to believe the present was a unique piece for one of Rolex's most influential clients.



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

The 'Beta 21' movement was first created in 1969, and made its debut during Basel later that year. At the time, the Beta 21 was revolutionary as it was the most accurate quartz movement to be offered on the market, and accurate to 5 seconds per month. Due to the movement's large and bulky size, watchmakers soon developed their own in house movements and gradually moved away from the 'Beta 21'.

The reference 5100, or the 'Beta 21', is a landmark reference for a number of reasons. Launched in 1970, it was Rolex's first reference to carry a quartz movement. Rolex first produced 1000 units to test the 'Beta 21', and all examples were sold out before the watch even hit the market. The 'Beta 21' was also Rolex's first reference to feature a sapphire crystal and quick set date function – two key innovations and components that are used in Rolex's current line of production.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

I think this watch is rather remarkable, as it is signed 'No. 1007' to the case back, and one of the very last examples ever made. Rolex quietly produced a very limited number of examples after releasing the first batch, attesting to the popularity and innovation of the reference.

The case is preserved in excellent condition, with strong gold and hallmarks to the right band. The proportions can only be described as excellent, with sharp facets to each side of the case.

Interestingly, two different kinds of bracelets were fitted to the 'Beta 21'. The present example features the second-generation bracelet, which is correct for the late case number.





ROLEX OYSTER CHRONOGRAPH

T MIGHT SOUND STRANGE, BUT the love affair between Rolex and chronograph watches was not so immediate as many actually believe. Rolex was focused, with clear insight, on building its water resistant Oyster models, and began to design chronographs only in 1937 releasing a few single-button versions with both coaxial and two o'clock positioned crowns, and before the beginning of the following decade followed-up by the Zerographe reference 3346, a rare technical chronostop.

By the late '30s, the early models featured two pushers that paved the way to the styles and functions that are still today incredibly contemporary. The chronographs created at the time were amongst the most interesting and fascinating pieces produced by Rolex, besides being slowly yet constantly appreciated by a number of elite collectors.


The true turning point of the chronograph production occurred in the '40s with one of the most successful Oyster chronographs, the reference 3525 christened the 'bariletto'. Other two Oyster milestones are the reference 6234, followed by the 6238, which is universally referred to as pre-Daytona. Clean and simple, it is one of the last chronographs to exhibit a 'soft' aesthetical design manufactured by Rolex. Highly sought-after and desired by collectors, it found its apex in the versions sporting rare and custom dials. Added to this, it is the last known Rolex chronograph, to feature a smooth bezel, with no engravings.

Then came the Daytona, but that is another story.

Production of reference 6234 was extremely limited. Since the reference's launch in 1955, approximately 2300 examples were produced in stainless steel. In contrast, scholars theorize that less than 150 examples were cased in 14k or 18k yellow gold. The reference ceased production after approximately six years of manufacture, replaced by reference 6238.

The present example, cased in 14k yellow gold, is extremely rare especially when one takes into account the reference's total production number. According to our research, approximately 100 examples were cased in 14k gold. Rolex scholars today hypothesize that watches cased in 14k yellow gold were intended for import to the US market.

Reference 6234 was fitted with a variety of dials, ranging from those with a matte or lacquer finish, to various subsidiary register sizes, and even contrasting tachometer/telemeter color combinations. These variations were used to gauge the market's tastes for chronograph wristwatches.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

At first glance, I am most impressed by the crisp condition of this early reference 6234. The case features sharp factory finishes to the top of the lugs and the case back. The 14k yellow gold hallmark, a squirrel, is punched deep into the back of the lug. The inside case back also displays the same 14k hallmark.

I also like how correct this example is. The movement is stamped ROW, which signifies the present watch was intended for import to the US market, which is correct considering the watch is cased in 14k yellow gold. The 14k bracelet is from the period, and is in wonderful condition.





Launched in 1960, reference 6238 is known as the 'Pre-Daytona'. The reference was the manufacture's last traditional chronograph wristwatch to feature a smooth bezel.

The tachometer was furthermore displayed directly on the dial, like its predecessor reference 6234. However, its successors such as reference 6239 or 6241, all feature a tachometer bezel, with the insert either made of steel or acrylic. The reference was fitted with a Valjoux 72 caliber.

Predominantly fitted with silvered dials, reference 6238 was also available with a matte or black lacquer dial. Collectors particularly favor these special dials, due to their stylish and unusual appearance, which sets them apart from the classic examples of reference 6238.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

This 'Pre-Daytona' features a wonderful matte black dial, which is very rare compared to its silvered counterparts. The present watch also features contrasting gilt graphics, which have aged to a warm ivory tone, giving the watch a wonderful vintage appearance.

The luminous, still round and fully formed, has turned light yellow with patina. This is very consistent with the luminous on the hands, which have also turned light yellow in tone.

The case has been preserved in excellent condition with sharp edges and milled finish to the top of the lugs. The lugs carry full proportions, and the pushers are original to the watch.



Launched in 1955, reference 6234 is better known as the 'Godfather' of Daytonas. While the reference ceased production around 1961, it inspired successors such as the 'Father' of Daytonas, the 6238, and finally references such as 6239, 6241, 6240, 6263, 6265 and so forth.

The reference most notably featured a tachometer scale on the outer track, and a telemeter scale printed in the inner track. At the time of production, the manual movement and Oyster case fit for an incredibly compact timepiece, made to withstand the elements. Valjoux, known for their high standard in quality, was selected to produce the movements.

Reference 6234 was cased in 14k or 18k gold, as well as in stainless steel. The 'Oyster Chronographs' also featured a variety of dial variations, ranging from those with smaller subsidiary registers, to ones fitted with an attractive black lacquer finish.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

The present watch is an exceedingly rare variant of reference 6234 as it is fitted with a black lacquer dial. Only a handful of watches fitted with such dials have appeared on the market so far, which makes the example illustrated here incredibly desirable.

While the black lacquer dial variation is already very rare, what truly sets this watch apart from its peers is its 'tropical' finish. It is astonishing to admire how a dial ages through time and develops its own distinctive character. Over the past fifty-six years, the present dial has 'turned' to an incredible strong brown color, which is very rich in tone and exhibits a full glossy finish. While the center is darker, it seems as if the color gradually



becomes lighter towards the edges, giving the dial an almost dégradé finish. Applied dagger numerals further compliment the dial, accompanied by round, perfectly formed and original luminous dots.

The case is furthermore preserved in excellent condition with sharp finishes, and the movement is stamped ROW, indicating the present watch was imported to the United States market. This watch ticks every requirement a stringent collector desires.





Introduced to the market in 1938, reference 3525 was available in pink gold, yellow gold, stainless steel or steel and gold combinations. The model is an important milestone reference, as it represents one of the firm's most important technological advancements. The reference 3525 was Rolex's very first chronograph wristwatch to be housed in an Oyster case, and equipped with a water resistant screw down case back along with screw down crown.

This particular watch is also very interesting as it is from the later generation of the reference. The serial numbers are engraved between the lugs, while the reference and case numbers on earlier examples were engraved on the outside case back.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

This very crisp and completely original example of a reference 3525 is cased in pink gold, which is the rarest case metal for the model.

The case, displaying bold proportions, is extremely sharp and most likely unpolished. The backs of the lugs are very angular and sharp in their construction, with one deep hallmark, attesting to its untouched condition.

Moreover, the case back is full in its proportions with a crisp milled edge to the inner portion. The right band furthermore displays a thin layer of uninterrupted, dark bronze patina, meaning the chronograph wristwatch has not been worn in a very long time. In fact, it was very likely sitting in a safe for most of its life. The watch furthermore retains its original Oyster crown with Brevet logo.



The dial is completely original and has been protected from the elements for decades, thanks to its Oyster case. It has been preserved in pristine condition; all graphics are clear without spotting or tamishing. Interestingly enough, there is virtually no signs of wear at all between the lugs, which display original grain finishing and unbelievably crisp serial numbers. Thus, the present leather strap is very likely original to the watch. This, coupled with the fitted presentation box, provides an insight to how this watch originally left the Rolex factory.

Named after champion sportsman and Rolex ambassador Jean-Claude

Killy, the 'Killy' is the only Rolex model to feature a full calendar and

chronograph complication. Two different generations of the 'Killy' precede

the present watch, starting from reference 4767 and 5036. Reference

6036 is the third generation example, followed by 6236.

The reference was typically cased in stainless steel. Yet, for their most discerning clients, Rolex also offered the model in yellow gold, steel and gold combinations, and most exclusively, in pink gold.

Fresh to the market and offered in astounding condition, the present watch fulfills the stringent requirements of any serious collector and scholar. Retailed at Serpico Y Laino, the celebrated retailer in Venezuela, the watch proudly features the firm's signature above 6 o'clock and stamped on the clasp. Only a select few retailers have had the privilege of stamping their name on Rolex watches.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

I am very impressed by this correct and complete pink gold 'Killy', which has been preserved in unbelievable condition.

Beautiful and original, the two-tone dial has aged, with the outer date ring slightly darker in color than the main portion of the dial. The dial is further



finished with pink gold numerals and hands that match its pink gold case and bracelet. The date wheel is Spanish, which is correct considering the watch was retailed in South America.

The case can only be described as breathtaking, with full lugs and incredibly balanced proportions. There is a strong and deep hallmark under the lug, and the reference number, gold marks and case maker mark for C.R. Spillmann SA are incredibly crisp to the case back. These markings on the case back were only used on South American imports. Even the slightest polishing would have completely wiped these marks off, attesting to the original condition of the watch.

The Gay Frères bracelet is furthermore stamped GF and S&L for the retailer, adding another element of interest. Accompanying this watch is its original guarantee with stamp for the retailer.









ROLEX COSMOGRAPH DAYTONA

HERE IS A KIND OF magic with some objects that makes them stand out, which governs its fortune and stardom with the public, and even more with consumers all over the world. It is a magic mixture of marketing, product, and destiny, which can modify the nature of what we buy or use, making it unique and highly desirable.

This is what happened to a timepiece, which over an almost 50-year life span has transformed its own essence: in the beginning it was a chronograph, today it is unquestionably 'the Daytona'. How this metamorphosis occurred, is an enigma – unresolved by Rolex itself.

Born as a manual winding sports chronograph, subject for the first twenty years of its life to continuous re-thinks on its commercial position, the Daytona has been lucky enough – or perhaps there was a genius at work? – to change its appeal at exactly the same time the watch changed from being merely a teller of time to a status symbol.

In fact, in 1988, the boom year for wristwatches, Rolex abandoned the manual charge – a remarkable contradiction if we only think about the crown that had to be constantly screwed and unscrewed every day – and finally introduced the automatic movement to its watches. At that moment, due to a supply shortage from Zenith, who built the base calibre 'El Primero', and also due to an evaluation error on the actual market demand for the new model, the dealers found themselves, within a couple of days, with long waiting lists for the consignment of what was to become a new legend.

At the same time, the by now old manual charged timepieces undertook a relatively swift step into a collectors market paradise, becoming in the process an icon, which up to the present day remains unchanged. No more so than with the 'Paul Newman'.

Reference 6239, first launched in 1963, was the very first Rolex chronograph wristwatch to officially feature the 'Cosmograph Daytona' signature. The 6239 reference ceased production after six years of manufacture, making way for successor reference 6262, featuring an upgraded Valjoux 727 movement and retaining non-screw down pushers.

While reference 6239 is perhaps best known for being fitted with Paul Newman dials, rarer still, is the presence the model cased in yellow gold.

Indeed, during the reference's life span, approximately 300 examples were cased in gold, which is astounding when one takes into account the model's 14,000 unit production run. The chronograph illustrated in these pages is thus exceedingly rare.

While the reference 6239 was considered a 'technical' watch, Rolex cased the model in yellow gold for their most exclusive and well-to-do customers, as a luxurious alternative to record time and measure speed.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

This watch features a wonderfully crisp case, with sharp gold and hallmarks beneath the lugs. Retaining original proportions, the watch features full lugs with sharp milled finishes. I particularly like that the bezel and pushers are original on this example.

The most beautiful feature, however, is the dial. The subsidiary registers have 'turned' a rich chocolate brown shade, contrasting with the gold graphics and soleil dial beautifully. The luminous dots are still intact, round and formed, and have aged to a dark yellow tone in the form of patina.

Launched in 1969, the references 6263 and 6265 were successors to the references 6241 and 6239, respectively. Thanks to improvements to the screw down pushers and crown, the chronograph wristwatch was now guaranteed waterproof to a depth of 50 meters and featured an 'Oyster' designation printed on the dial.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

This very attractive watch, with 2.8 million serial number, is among the first series of reference 6265. The case back is further stamped 6262, signifying that the watch was part of the first batch produced. Research suggests that Rolex fitted early examples of 6263 and 6265 with left over case backs from previous models.

Aside from these subtle details, the most striking aspect of this watch is the dial. The superb silver soleil dial is enhanced by 'tropical' subsidiary registers, which have turned from a black, to a subtle warm chocolate brown color. It is astounding that the registers have aged so evenly. The luminous dots are furthermore intact, and perfectly round on the dial.

The case is impressive, retaining its proportions and milled finishes to the top of the lugs. This watch is also fitted with the correct bezel and pushers. This watch is completed with its original guarantee along with presentation box. The provenance of this watch is remarkable, having been sold at Christie's historic Rolex Daytona "Lesson One" sale, lot 22.

The 'Paul Newman' has become one of the most fashionable and discerning chronograph wristwatches among Rolex collectors today. The unusual dial layout, coupled with 'matchstick' registers, is instantly recognizable upon a glance.

The Paul Newman reference 6263 generally features either a white or black dial. Those fitted with a white dial and black subsidiary registers, such as the present watch, are given the moniker 'Panda', due to its color scheme that mimics its namesake. In contrast, those fitted with a black dial, white registers and a red outer track are dubbed 'Oyster Sotto', due to the dial configuration of the watch.

While the 'Panda' is considered a vintage wristwatch, its appearance is still incredibly modern today. Due to the reference's unpopularity at the time of production, only very limited number of pieces were ever manufactured. Many retailers had 'Paul Newmans' sitting in stock years after its production. As such, the model is much rarer compared to its non-Paul Newman counterparts.

A similar example was sold at Phillips' START-STOP-RESET: 88 Epic Stainless Steel Chronographs, lot 34, for an astounding 929,000 CHF.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

The 'Paul Newman' Cosmograph Daytona has undergone subtle changes throughout its production history. The present watch, featuring a desirable Mk 2 dial, displays sharp serifs to the 'Oyster Cosmograph' graphics.



In contrast, watches fitted with a Mk 1 dial do not feature serifs to the 'Oyster Cosmograph' graphics.

This wristwatch also features its original Mk 1 pushers, which is correct when one considers the serial number. The dial has been preserved in really excellent condition, and the outer track has aged to a warm 'tropical' tone, displaying a fascinating brown chocolate colour shade that is a sight to behold.

The case is wonderful, with sharp edges and milled finish. The watch furthermore retains its original bracelet, stamped for the first quarter of 1971. Rarer still is the presence of the original punched guarantee from South America, dated 4 December 1974, which brings the watch to another level in terms of collectability.







Reference 6265 was introduced to the market approximately in 1970, and ceased production in 1987. While the reference was mainly cased in stainless steel, limited amounts were also cased in 18k or 14k yellow gold. Reference 6265 was in production for almost 20 years, yet no more than 2000 examples were cased in gold.

From the early 1980s and onwards, gold examples featured a movement number engraved on the plate, behind the balance wheel. Research suggests that this was related to the officially certified chronometer movement. Around this period, Rolex modified the dial layout for gold versions, and the 'OCC' designation was printed on the dial.

Of particular note is the guarantee, with punched country code for Hong Kong (400), stating the watch was retailed at Zurich Watch Co. We are delighted that this watch has returned home, thirty years since its original sale, ready to be cherished by its next owner.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

This example, among the very last batch of 6265s ever made, is preserved in excellent condition with sharp edges and deep hallmarks to the back of the lugs. The case back displays a crisp milled finish.

The matte black dial contrasts wonderfully with the gold graphics, and the luminous dots are perfectly formed. The watch retains its original pushers and bezel, along with punched guarantee, sales tag and fitted presentation box, which is all complete and original.

The most exclusive and sought-after variant of reference 6263 is, with great certainty, the 'Oyster Sotto Paul Newman'. In fact, Rolex scholars estimate that less than 20 examples have ever graced the market.

The phrase 'Oyster Sotto', or 'Oyster Beneath' in Italian, signifies the correct dial configuration of a reference 6263 'Paul Newman' with three-color black dial. A correct black dial is always printed 'Rolex Cosmograph Oyster', as opposed to 'Rolex Oyster Cosmograph', the latter of which is correct for a 'Paul Newman Panda' with white dial. The black 'Oyster Sottos' are the rarest among all Paul Newmans ever produced.

It is interesting to note that 'Oyster Sotto' dials were fitted to the earliest 6263s, which newly featured waterproof screw down pushers. The dials were originally fitted to non-waterproof references 6262 or 6264, which bore 'Rolex Cosmograph' only. The 'Oyster' designation was thus later added to the dial, to denote reference 6263's waterproof ability. Hence, the 'Oyster' print does not display any serifs, and looks unusual compared to the 'Rolex Cosmograph' font.

The 'Oyster Sotto' has reached new heights in popularity, particularly after having achieved a record-breaking price of 1,985,000 CHF at Phillips' START-STOP-RESET: 88 Epic Stainless Steel Chronographs sale, lot 31.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

The 'Oyster Sotto' is a very elusive watch, one that hardly ever appears on the market. Correct examples are very hard to find, given the popularity of 'Paul Newman' wristwatches today.



As such, I am very pleased to present this 'Oyster Sotto'. While it was produced among the last batch of 'Oyster Sotto' 6263s with a 2.200 million serial number, the dial is completely original with round and complete luminous dots. The Mk 2 dial features a slightly elongated 'tail' to the 'R' in Rolex, and the white subsidiary dials have aged to an ivory tone. The case back, stamped 6262 is also correct for the 'Oyster Sotto' Paul Newman.

The case is preserved in great condition with sharp finishes, original Mk 1 millerighe pushers, and correct bezel. The bracelet is from the period.

A similar example is prominently illustrated in *Ultimate Rolex Daytona*, by Pucci Papaleo, page 400.

Rolex watches have long been favored by Sheiks, army officials and the ruling party in the Middle East. It comes as no surprise that these timepieces were also their gift of choice, particularly in the 1970s. During this time, Rolex received a number of special orders for dials featuring the coat of arms, or the names of the royal family.

Having never appeared at auction before, this correct reference 6263 features a custom dial with the UAE Quraysh Hawk. Made upon special request for Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Emir of Dubai in the mid-1970, the present watch was part of an order comprising a few dozen timepieces. Reference 6263, introduced to the market in 1969, was available until the mid 1980s. Fitted with an acrylic bezel insert and screw down pump pushers, the watch was a commercial success.

Most interestingly, this watch is 'one' serial number apart from the very same model sold at Phillips' historical START-STOP-RESET: 88 Epic Steel Chronographs sale, which fetched a staggering price of 605,000 CHF, further legitimizing the present example.

JOHN GOLDBERGER'S OPINION

There are many points of interest regarding this watch. Firstly, the dial is in incredible condition and is very attractive. Rendered in polychrome relief



printing, the UAE emblem (the Quraysh Hawk) is emblazoned at 12 o'clock, with the signature of Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum proudly displayed below. Above 6 o'clock is the signature of the Wazarah Ad Difa'A department written in Arabic script. These graphics are all original and correct.

The 'Sigma' dial is also correct for this model. The dial features angular numeral markers, softly shimmering in a way that only white gold can. The luminous is round and perfectly formed, having turned with light orange patina, which match the hands.

The excellent condition of the case is also very striking. Featuring sharp finishes to the top of the lugs and edges, the watch retains its original screw down pushers and bezel insert. The bracelet, stamped for the first quarter of 1976 is also original to the watch.

The present lot's rarity and attractive appearance places it among one of the most impressive Cosmograph Daytona models in recent years.

The watch is furthermore fitted with Rolex's legendary Zenith 'El Primero' movement, Rolex's first automatic Daytona movement. This movement is now discontinued, and highly sought after among collectors today.

The buyer's premium is payable by the buyer as part of the total purchase price at the following rates: 25% of the hammer price up to and including HK\$1,600,000, 20% of the portion of the hammer price above HK\$1,600,000 up to and including HK\$22,500,000 and 12% of the portion of the hammer price above HK\$22.500,000.

The purchase price payable for any lot is the sum of the hammer price plus the buyer's premium plus any applicable tax and charges.

Unless indicated by a \bullet , all lots in this catalogue are offered subject to a reserve. A reserve is the confidential value established between Phillips and the seller and below which a lot may not be sold. The reserve for each lot is generally set at a percentage of the low estimate and will not exceed the low pre-sale estimate.

∑ Endangered Species

Lots with this symbol have been identified at the time of cataloguing as containing endangered or other protected species of wildlife which may be subject to restrictions regarding export or import and which may require permits for export as well as import. 2 Bidding in the Sale

Bidding at Auction

Bids may be executed during the auction in person by paddle, by telephone, online or prior to the sale in writing by absentee bid. **Proof of identity in the form of government-issued identification will be required, as will an original signature.** We may also require that you furnish us with a bank reference.

Bidding in Person

To bid in person, you will need to register for and collect a paddle before the auction begins. New clients are encouraged to register at least 48 hours in advance of a sale to allow sufficient time for us to process your information. All lots sold will be invoiced to the name and address to which the paddle has been registered and invoices cannot be transferred to other names and addresses. Please do not misplace your paddle. In the event you lose it, inform a Phillips staff member immediately. At the end of the auction, please return your paddle to the registration desk.

Bidding by Telephone

If you cannot attend the auction, you may bid live on the telephone with one of our multilingual staff members. This service must be arranged at least 24 hours in advance of the sale and is available for lots whose low pre-sale estimate is at least HK\$8,000. Telephone bids may be recorded. Follow the links to 'Auctions' and 'Digital Saleroom' and then pre-register by clicking on 'Register to Bid Live.' The first time you register you will be required to create an account; thereafter you will only need to register for each sale. You must pre-register at least 24 hours before the start of the auction in order to be approved by our bid department. Please note that corporate firewalls may cause difficulties for online bidders.

If you are unable to attend the auction and cannot participate by telephone, Phillips will be happy to execute written bids on your behalf. A bidding form can be found at the back of this catalogue. This service is free and confidential. Bids must be placed in the currency of the sale. Our staff will attempt to execute an absentee bid at the lowest possible price taking into account the reserve and other bidders. Always indicate a maximum bid, excluding the buyer's premium. Unlimited bids will not be accepted. Any absentee bid must be received at least 24 hours in advance of the sale. In the event of identical bids. the earliest bid received will take precedence.

Employee Bidding

3 The Auction

As noted above, the auction is governed by the Conditions of Sale and Authorship Warranty. All prospective bidders should read them carefully. They may be amended by saleroom addendum or auctioneer's announcement.

Interested Parties Announcement

In situations where a person allowed to bid on a lot has a direct or indirect interest in such lot, such as the beneficiary or executor of an estate selling the lot, a joint owner of the lot or a party providing or participating in a guarantee on the lot, Phillips will make an announcement in the saleroom that interested parties may bid on the lot.

Consecutive and Responsive Bidding; No Reserve Lots

The auctioneer may open the bidding on any lot by placing a bid on behalf of the seller. The auctioneer may further bid on behalf of the seller up to the amount of the reserve by placing consecutive bids or bids in response to other bidders. If a lot is offered without reserve, unless there are already competing absentee bids, the auctioneer will generally open the bidding at 50% of the lot's low pre-sale estimate. 4 After the Auction

Buyers are required to pay for purchases immediately following the auction unless other arrangements have been agreed with Phillips in writing in advance of the sale. Collection

It is our policy to request proof of identity on collection of a lot. A lot will be released to the buyer or the buyer's authorized representative when Phillips has received full and cleared payment and we are not owed any other amount by the buyer. After the auction, all lots will be kept at our offices at Room 1301, 13/F York House, Landmark, Central, Hong Kong.

Loss or Damage

Buyers are reminded that Phillips accepts liability for loss or damage to lots for a maximum of seven days following the auction.

Transport and Shipping

As a free service for buyers, Phillips will wrap purchased lots for hand carry only. We do not provide packing, handling or shipping services directly. However, we will coordinate with shipping agents instructed by you in order to facilitate the packing, handling and shipping of property purchased at Phillips. Please refer to Paragraph 7 of the Conditions of Sale for more information.

Export and Import Licences

Before bidding for any property, prospective bidders are advised to make independent enquiries as to whether a licence is required to export the property from Hong Kong or to import it into another country. It is the buyer's sole responsibility to comply with all import and export laws and to obtain any necessary licences or permits. The denial of any required licence or permit or any delay in obtaining such documentation will not justify the cancellation of the sale or any delay in making full payment for the lot.

Endangered Species

Items made of or incorporating plant or animal material, such as coral, crocodile, ivory, whalebone. This will require the buyer to obtain an independent appraisal certifying the species of endangered material on the object and certifying that the object is not less than 100 years of age. Important Notices

Condition

Phillips makes no representation or warranty that any watch or clock is in working order, and no catalogue description of any lot should be construed as so stating. Prospective buyers are advised to have watches and clocks checked by a competent watchmaker or watch or clock restorer before use. As a service to prospective buyers, we may provide a description of the condition of watches and clocks in the catalogue entry, including references to defects and repairs, and furnish a condition report, but such information is not necessarily complete and may not specify all mechanical replacements, restorations or defects. Please note that Phillips does not guarantee the authenticity of any individual components parts, such as wheels, hands, crowns, crystals, screws, bracelets and leather bands, since prior repairs and restoration work may have resulted in the replacement of original parts. Nor does Phillips warrant that watches in water-resistant cases are currently water-resistant. Prospective buyers should inspect all watches and clocks prior to the auction to evaluate the condition of property offered for sale.

Exportation of Watch Bands Incorporating Material from Endangered Species

Conditions of Sale

The Conditions of Sale and Authorship Warranty set forth below govern the relationship between bidders and buyers, on the one hand, and Phillips and sellers, on the other hand. All prospective buyers should read these Conditions of Sale, the Important Notices immediately following the Guide for Prospective Buyers and the Authorship Warranty carefully before bidding.

1 Introduction

Each lot in this catalogue is offered for sale and sold subject to: (a) the Conditions of Sale and Authorship Warranty; (b) additional notices and terms printed in other places in this catalogue, including the Guide for Prospective Buyers and Important Notices and (c) supplements to this catalogue or other written material posted by Phillips in the saleroom, in each case as amended by any addendum or announcement by the auctioneer prior to the auction.

By bidding at the auction, whether in person, through an agent, by written bid, by telephone bid or other means, bidders and buyers agree to be bound by these Conditions of Sale, as so changed or supplemented, and Authorship Warranty.

These Conditions of Sale, as so changed or supplemented, and Authorship Warranty contain all the terms on which Phillips and the seller contract with the buyer.

2 Phillips as Agent

Phillips acts as an agent for the seller, unless otherwise indicated in this catalogue or at the time of auction. On occasion, Phillips may own a lot directly, in which case we will act in a principal capacity as a consignor, or a company affiliated with Phillips may own a lot, in which case we will act as agent for that company, or Phillips or an affiliated company may have a legal, beneficial or financial interest in a lot as a secured creditor or otherwise.

3 Catalogue Descriptions and Condition of Property

Lots are sold subject to the Authorship Warranty, as described in the catalogue (unless such description is changed or supplemented, as provided in Paragraph 1 above) and in the condition that they are in at the time of the sale on the following basis.

- (a) The knowledge of Phillips in relation to each lot is partially dependent on information provided to us by the seller, and Phillips is not able to and does not carry out exhaustive due diligence on each lot. Prospective buyers acknowledge this fact and accept responsibility for carrying out inspections and investigations to satisfy themselves as to the lots in which they may be interested. Notwithstanding the foregoing, we shall exercise such reasonable care when making express statements in catalogue descriptions or condition reports as is consistent with our role as auctioneer of lots in this sale and in light of (i) the information provided to us by the seller, (ii) scholarship and technical knowledge and (iii) the generally accepted opinions of relevant experts, in each case at the time any such express statement is made.
- (b) Each lot offered for sale at Phillips is available for inspection by prospective buyers prior to the auction. Phillips accepts bids on lots on the basis that bidders (and independent experts on their behalf, to the extent appropriate given the nature and value of the lot and the bidder's own expertise) have fully inspected the lot prior to bidding and have satisfied themselves as to both the condition of the lot and the accuracy of its description.
- (c) Prospective buyers acknowledge that many lots are of an age and type which means that they are not in perfect condition. 4 Bidding at Auction

(a) Phillips has absolute discretion to refuse admission to the auction or participation in the sale. All bidders must register for a paddle prior to bidding, supplying such information and references as required by Phillips.

(b) As a convenience to bidders who cannot attend the auction in person, Phillips may, if so instructed by the bidder, execute written absentee bids on a bidder's behalf. Absentee bidders are required to submit bids on the 'Absentee Bid Form', a copy of which is printed in this catalogue or otherwise available from Phillips. Bids must be placed in the currency of the sale. The bidder must clearly indicate the maximum amount he or she intends to bid, excluding the buyer's premium. The auctioneer will not accept an instruction to execute an absentee bid which does not indicate such maximum bid. Our staff will attempt to execute an absentee bid at the lowest possible price taking into account the reserve and other bidders. Any absentee bid must be received at least 24 hours in advance of the sale. In the event of identical bids, the earliest bid received will take precedence.

- (c) Telephone bidders are required to submit bids on the 'Telephone Bid Form', a copy of which is printed in this catalogue or otherwise available from Phillips. Telephone bidding is available for lots whose low pre-sale estimate is at least HK\$8,000. Phillips reserves the right to require written confirmation of a successful bid from a telephone bidder by fax or otherwise immediately after such bid is accepted by the auctioneer. Telephone bids may be recorded and, by bidding on the telephone, a bidder consents to the recording of the conversation.
- (d) Bidders may participate in an auction by bidding online through Phillips's online live bidding platform available on our website at www.phillips.com. To bid online, bidders must register online at least 24 hours before the start of the auction. Online bidding is subject to approval by Phillips's bid department in our sole discretion. As noted in Paragraph 3 above, Phillips encourages online bidders to inspect prior to the auction any lot(s) on which they may bid, and condition reports are available upon request. Bidding in a live auction can progress quickly. To ensure that online bidders are not placed at a disadvantage when bidding against bidders in the room or on the telephone, the procedure for placing bids through Phillips's online bidding platform is a one-step process. By clicking the bid button on the computer screen, a bidder submits a bid. Online bidders acknowledge and agree that $bids \ so \ submitted \ are \ final \ and \ may \ not \ under \ any \ circumstances \ be \ amended \ or \ retracted.$ During a live auction, when bids other than online bids are placed, they will be displayed on the online bidder's computer screen as 'floor' bids. 'Floor' bids include bids made by the auctioneer to protect the reserve. In the event that an online bid and a 'floor' or 'phone' bid are identical, the 'floor' bid may take precedence at the auctioneer's discretion. The next bidding increment is shown for the convenience of online bidders in the bid button. - (f) By participating in the auction, whether in person, by absentee bid, on the telephone or online, each prospective buyer represents and warrants that any bids placed by such person, or on such person's behalf, are not the product of any collusive or other anticompetitive agreement and are otherwise consistent with federal and state antitrust law.
- (g) Arranging absentee, telephone and online bids is a free service provided by Phillips to prospective buyers. While we undertake to exercise reasonable care in undertaking such activity, we cannot accept liability for failure to execute such bids except where such failure is caused by our willful misconduct.
- (h) Employees of Phillips and our affiliated companies, including the auctioneer, may bid at the auction by placing absentee bids so long as they do not know the reserve when submitting their absentee bids and otherwise comply with our employee bidding procedures.

5 Conduct of the Auction

- (a) Unless otherwise indicated by the symbol •, each lot is offered subject to a reserve, which is the confidential minimum selling price agreed by Phillips with the seller. The reserve will not exceed the low pre-sale estimate at the time of the auction.
- (b) The auctioneer has discretion at any time to refuse any bid, withdraw any lot, re-offer a lot for sale (including after the fall of the hammer) if he or she believes there may be error or dispute and take such other action as he or she deems reasonably appropriate. Phillips shall have no liability whatsoever for any such action taken by the auctioneer. If any dispute arises after the sale, our sale record is conclusive. The auctioneer may accept bids made by a company affiliated with Phillips provided that the bidder does not know the reserve placed on the lot.
- (c) The auctioneer will commence and advance the bidding at levels and in increments he or she considers appropriate. In order to protect the reserve on any lot, the auctioneer may place one or more bids on behalf of the seller up to the reserve without indicating he or she is doing so, either by placing consecutive bids or bids in response to other bidders. If a lot is offered without reserve, unless there are already competing absentee bids, the auctioneer will generally open the bidding at 50% of the lot's low pre-sale estimate. In the absence of a bid at that level, the auctioneer will proceed backwards at his or her discretion until a bid is recognized and will then advance the bidding from that amount. Absentee bids on no reserve lots will, in the absence of a higher bid, be executed at approximately 50% of the low pre-sale estimate or at the amount of the bid if it is less than 50% of the low pre-sale estimate. If there is no bid whatsoever on a no reserve lot, the auctioneer may deem such lot unsold.
- (d) The sale will be conducted in Hong Kong dollars and payment is due in Hong Kong dollars. For the benefit of international clients, pre-sale estimates in the auction catalogue may be shown in US dollars and/or euros and, if so, will reflect approximate exchange rates. Accordingly, estimates in US dollars or euros should be treated only as a guide. If a currency converter is operated during the sale, it is done so as a courtesy to bidders, but Phillips accepts no responsibility for any errors in currency conversion calculation.

- (e) Subject to the auctioneer's reasonable discretion, the highest bidder accepted by the auctioneer will be the buyer and the striking of the hammer marks the acceptance of the highest bid and the conclusion of a contract for sale between the seller and the buyer. Risk and responsibility for the lot passes to the buyer as set forth in Paragraph 7 below.
- (f) If a lot is not sold, the auctioneer will announce that it has been 'passed', 'withdrawn', 'returned to owner' or 'bought-in'.
- (g) Any post-auction sale of lots offered at auction shall incorporate these Conditions of Sale and Authorship Warranty as if sold in the auction.

6 Purchase Price and Payment

- (a) The buyer agrees to pay us, in addition to the hammer price of the lot, the buyer's premium, plus any applicable tax and charges (the 'Purchase Price'). The buyer's premium is 25% of the hammer price up to and including HK\$1,600,000, 20% of the portion of the hammer price above HK\$1,600,000 up to and including HK\$22,500,000 and 12% of the portion of the hammer price above HK\$22,500,000. Phillips reserves the right to pay from our compensation an introductory commission to one or more third parties for assisting in the sale of property offered and sold at auction.
- (b) Unless otherwise agreed, a buyer is required to pay for a purchased lot immediately following the auction regardless of any intention to obtain an export or import license or other permit for such lot. Payments must be made by the invoiced party in Hong Kong dollars by wire transfer in accordance with the bank transfer details provided on the invoice for purchased lots.
- (c) As a courtesy to clients, Phillips will accept American Express, Visa and MasterCard to pay for invoices of HK\$800,000 or less. A processing fee will apply.
- (d) Title in a purchased lot will not pass until Phillips has received the Purchase Price for that lot in cleared funds. Phillips is not obliged to release a lot to the buyer until title in the lot has passed and appropriate identification has been provided, and any earlier release does not affect the passing of title or the buyer's unconditional obligation to pay the Purchase Price.

7 Collection of Property

- (a) Phillips will not release a lot to the buyer until we have received payment of its Purchase Price in full in cleared funds, the buyer has paid all outstanding amounts due to Phillips or any of our affiliated companies, including any charges payable pursuant to Paragraph 8 (a) below, and the buyer has satisfied such other terms as we in our sole discretion shall require, including completing any anti-money laundering or anti-terrorism financing checks. As soon as a buyer has satisfied all of the foregoing conditions, he or she should contact us at +852 2318 2000 to arrange for collection of purchased property.
- (b) The buyer must arrange for collection of a purchased lot within seven days of the date of the auction. After the auction, all lots will be kept at our offices at Room 1301, 13/F York House, Landmark, Central, Hong Kong. Purchased lots are at the buyer's risk, including the responsibility for insurance, from (i) the date of collection or (ii) seven days after the auction, whichever is the earlier. Until risk passes, Phillips will compensate the buyer for any loss or damage to a purchased lot up to a maximum of the Purchase Price paid, subject to our usual exclusions for loss or damage to property.
- (c) As a courtesy to clients, Phillips will, without charge, wrap purchased lots for hand carry only. We do not provide packing, handling, insurance or shipping services. We will coordinate with shipping agents instructed by the buyer, whether or not recommended by Phillips, in order to facilitate the packing, handling, insurance and shipping of property bought at Phillips. Any such instruction is entirely at the buyer's risk and responsibility, and we will not be liable for acts or omissions of third party packers or shippers.
- (d) Phillips will require presentation of government-issued identification prior to release of a lot to the buyer or the buyer's authorized representative.

8 Failure to Collect Purchases

- (a) If the buyer pays the Purchase Price but fails to collect a purchased lot within 30 days of the auction, the buyer will incur a late collection fee of HK\$80 per day for each uncollected lot. We will not release purchased lots to the buyer until all such charges have been paid in full.
- (b) If a purchased lot is paid for but not collected within six months of the auction, the buyer authorizes Phillips, upon notice, to arrange a resale of the item by auction or private sale, with estimates and a reserve set at Phillips's reasonable discretion. The proceeds of such sale will be applied to pay for storage charges and any other outstanding costs and expenses owed by the buyer to Phillips or our affiliated companies and the remainder will be forfeited unless collected by the buyer within two years of the original auction.

9 Remedies for Non-Payment

10 Rescission by Phillips

(b) In order to provide our services, we may disclose your personal data to third parties, including professional advisors, shippers and credit agencies. We will disclose, share with and transfer your personal data to Phillips's affiliated persons (natural or legal) for administration, sale and auction related purposes. You expressly consent to such transfer of your personal data, including sensitive personal data. We will not sell, rent or otherwise transfer any of your personal

data to third parties except as otherwise expressly provided in this Paragraph 12.

13 Limitation of Liability

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
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
